This is in response to the request, dated March 17, 1992, regarding your status as an organization exempt from Federal Income Tax.

Our records indicate that a ruling letter was issued in September, 1976 granting your organization an exemption from Federal Income Tax under the provisions of Section 501 (c) (6) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954.

If your gross receipts each year are normally more than \$25,000.00, you are required to file Form 990. Return of Organization Exempt from Income Tax by the fifteenth day of the fifth month after the end of your accounting period.

You are not required to file Federal Income Tax returns unless you are subject to the tax on unrelated business income under Section 511 of the Code. If you are subject to this tax, you must file an Income Tax return on Form 990-T.

If any question arises with respect to your status for Federal Income Tax purposes, you may use this letter as evidence of your exemption.





We, the undersigned, Mary R. Ostrander, President, and Mary J. Winn, Financial Secretary, of the International Association of Policewomen, a Corporation organized pursuant to the code of laws in and for the District of Columbia, so hereby certify that at a duly held meeting of the Board of Directors of said Corporation on the 3rd day of May, 1969, upon the written consent of more than two-thirds of the number of Board of Directors, a resolution was adopted changing the name of said Corporation from International Association of Policewomen to International Association of Women Police by deleting Article First of said Certificate of Incorporation and substituting therefor a new Article First as follows:

"The name or title by which this Association shall be known in Law shall be the International Association of Women Police."


