

Media Release COVID - 19 Global Pandemic - IAWP's Response - Update 58th IAWP Annual Training Conference, Indonesia, 2020

First of all, we want to pay tribute to the police and other emergency services working tirelessly around the globe protecting their communities from the spread of this disease, many, as we know, are working without appropriate protection.

This devastating global situation has an imminent impact on our ability to conduct the 2020 Indonesia Conference as planned and agreed. Our overarching concern is for the well-being of our members and delegates already registered for our conference as well as police and law enforcement organizations who need their staff to work within their local communities now, and very likely months into the future.

The IAWP Board of Directors, the 2020 Conference Directors and the Indonesian National Police have together made the decision to postpone the 58th Annual Training Conference until September 2021 (Specific dates will be annuanced at the earliest opportunity).

We believe this to be in the best interests of everyone at this time as it allows for what seems significant and necessary time for post pandemic recovery of all aspects of life; medical, work, school, social, travel, etc. It also allows for economic recovery of our members as well as police and law enforcement agencies. The safety and well-being of all potential attendees was our paramount concern and with the impact on countries changing daily we needed to make a decision about the feasibility of hosting our conference.
