Dr. Adderley's professional background is attributed to her quest for knowledge. She holds a Doctor of Education in Organizational Leadership and Human Resource Services, Master in Business Administration, Master degree

in Homeland Security and Criminal Justice, Bachelor's in Criminology and an Associates in Law and Criminal Justice, Bachelor Degree in Law (LLB, May 2024). Because of her outstanding work and execution of her duties she was endowed with the Meritorious medal, Long Service and Good Conduct medal, and the 2006 recipient of the Bahamas Independence Award for Women in Policing.

Additionally, Superintendent Adderley is an active member of the International Association of Chiefs of Police (IACP) and The National Association of Women in Law Enforcement Executive (NAWLEE) as an international member.

As an active participant in the activities of the Department of Gender and Family Affairs Unit at the Ministry of Social Services and Urban Development, she has been a delegate for the Bahamas on The Commission of the Status of Women (CSW) at the United Nations on several occasions. She has attended and presented at several Inter-American Development Bank (IDB) conferences and seminars throughout the region from 2018-2020. She was appointed as the National Emergency Management Agency (NEMA) liaison officer for the Royal Bahamas Police Force during hurricane Dorian and participate in research projects involving the RBPF conducted by the IDB.
